Dear Knights of Columbus:

Last month I mentioned, "the real weapon of the Knights is and always has been the Most Holy Rosary." It taps into the wealth of wisdom and power of God. And though repetitious, the rosary is a versatile way of prayer.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us there are three basic expressions of prayer: vocal, meditation, and contemplative prayer. If we pray it well, the rosary uses all three expressions. Vocal prayer uses words to express the heart. Meditation is a quest of the mind to understand the mysteries of our faith. And among other things, "Contemplative prayer is the poor and humble surrender to the loving will of the Father in ever deeper union with his beloved Son." (CCC #2712)

We vocally say (with our lips or in our heart) the Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be and other prayers in the Rosary. But do we believe them? Are we reaching out to the Lord with our words? Or do we say the words mindlessly? This will make the difference between boring repetition and peaceful prayer.
